

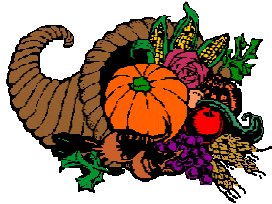

Foothills Quilters Guild Minutes

October 25, 2007

The Foothills Quilters Guild met on October 25, 2007 at the Ascension Lutheran Church in Shelby, North Carolina. President Brenda Arrowood began the meeting by welcoming members and guests.

Suzy Bridges, Vice President-membership, introduced visitor Jenny Reed. Minutes for the last meeting were approved as written. The prayer list was updated.

President Brenda Arrowood thanked all that worked so hard on the quilt show, and she said that she heard no negative comments, only compliments on the quilts and the decisions of the judges. Brenda also read statements from the tax code of North Carolina that said for the guild to keep our tax exempt status, we can't allow the boutique to sell items that the guild members make money from; all money must go to the guild.

Brenda announced that the quilt show had 662 paid attendees. Money collected included \$1986 from door fees, \$2464 from the donation quilt, \$1866 from the boutique, \$168 from the fat quarter baskets, \$575 from vendor fees, and \$150 from vendor advertising in the program, for a net profit of \$4279.

Dee Batayte announced that she had the CD's of the quilt show and to see her if a guild member wanted one. She also announced that some members had not picked up the description cards that were on their quilts at the show and these cards were at a table on the side of the room.

Ginny Huntley announced that some members had not picked up their judges evaluation forms and these were on a table in the back. Ginny also announced that Sandy Thomas was moving to a new store and had offered her store's classroom for the UFO days.

Brenda also showed the newspaper article in the Forest City paper about sisters Teresa Boume, Sally Norman, Sylvia Lancaster, and Mary Gregg, and their quilts made in memory of Teresa's daughter. The article will be placed in the guild's history files.

Ellen Yunker is looking for any members that would be willing to help some art teachers teach 4th graders how to make a quilt. Please see Ellen if you are interested in helping.

The following members had items for Show and tell: Rose McEathron, Ann Hutchins, Lueva Drake, Carolyn Sipes, Carol McCraw, and Sandy Thomas (two items for South Mt.).

Molly Savage, Vice President-Programs, announced that the November quilt meeting would consist of the following demos: Cathy Earls would demo making "Grandmothers Flower Garden" quilt, Lee Holman would demo machine quilting feathers on a domestic sewing machine, Harriette Grigg would demo thread painting, and Susan McCarty and Dee Batayte would demo an array of appliqué techniques.

The December meeting would be our annual Christmas party and everyone is asked to bring for a "Great Show And Tell" an item that they have made for a holiday, and it didn't have to be a Christmas idea, it can be an item for any holiday.

Members were reminded to bring their items for the South Mountain children's home to the November meeting. Items can include treats, stocking, and stocking stuffers for middle age children and teens.

Molly Savage, Vice President-Programs, introduced the program "Photos to Fabric" by Judy Simmons.

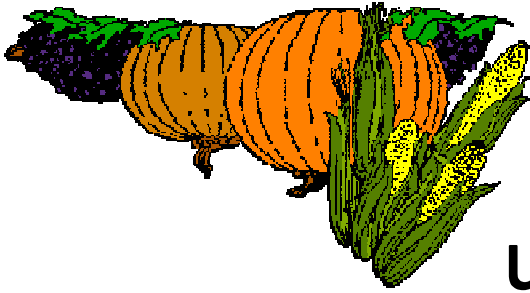
